INTRODUCTION

Broughton Anglican College seeks to provide opportunities for students, who have displayed a level of excellence in identified areas, to develop their gifts and talents in a Christian environment.

By offering scholarships, Campbelltown Anglican Schools aims to encourage students to develop their excellence in their chosen area and share their passion with others.

WHY BROUGHTON?

The College recognises that Gifted and Talented students demonstrate unique characteristics and have particular learning needs that require targeted adjustments and teaching and learning interventions.

The College provides a well-established system of subject and grade acceleration as well as differentiation and enrichment within the classroom. Broughton has a strong focus on developing the whole child and as such, academic adjustments are also supported through targeted pastoral care programs.

At Broughton, we seek to develop in our students an understanding of the Gospel message of Jesus Christ and the importance of serving God. We offer students the opportunity to gather together with the College Chaplain to grow and mature as Christians who are active in the life and ministry of the College.

We are committed to provide an academically rigorous education in a dynamic Christian environment so that all students may be given the opportunity to develop their full God given potential. Scholarships are available for students entering Year 7 and 11 in 2028 in the following categories:

Academic Scholarship	Academic scholarships could be awarded for general overall academic excellence, or excellence in a specific subject-area , where excellence is above grade level.
Performance Scholarship	Performance scholarships could be awarded for any area of performance or multiple, including: • Drama • Visual Arts • Music • Sport
Leadership / Service Scholarship	Leadership / Service scholarships could be awarded for students who have significant positive influence on the student body. This scholarship may be awarded for service for specific areas such as: • Christian leadership / service • First Nations

WHAT DOES A SCHOLARSHIP INVOLVE?

Recipients of a Broughton scholarship are offered additional opportunities and benefits in line with their unique characteristics.

Students who are offered a scholarship receive a percentage discount on their tuition fee for the remainder of their enrolment at Broughton.

The size of this discount varies from year to year and student to student, and is determined by the Executive staff based on the number of successful candidates and the calibre of the applications.

Scholarship Students:

- have access to regular support from a scholarship mentor in their specialist area.
- have access to specially designed Gifted Cocurricular Programs and competitions such as da Vinci Decathlon, Gifted and Talented Art Initiatives, ICAS Competitions, Tournament of Minds plus an array of faculty based opportunities.
- receive specialist help from Pastoral Care Teams and the Gifted Education pastoral care support looking at wellbeing for Gifted Students.
- are given opportunities to run and lead many academic programs in curricular and cocurricular streams.
- are given tracking of academic progress and support.
- have access to a long-established acceleration program (whole Grade or subject specific).
- have access to extension classes through streaming / clustering to facilitate connections with like-minded peers.
- are given opportunities to be an ambassador for the College in domain specific fields (e.g. Academic / Creative Arts / Christian Ministry).

Scholarship Students are expected to:

- Maintain excellence in the area of their scholarship.
- Participate in a range of co-curricular and curricular programs relating to the area of their scholarship.
- Maintain a high standard of behaviour and integrity with College expectations.
- Be positive ambassadors for the College, including giving permission for the College to share information relating to their success in external marketing.
- Be positive and public ambassadors for their scholarship area within the College community, details of this will be negotiated annually with their scholarship mentor.

Scholarships are reviewed every semester and students who do not maintain the requirements after a warning may have their scholarship revoked.





APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants for Academic Scholarships must apply online through the [Academic Assessment Services portal](#), upload the required documents and sit the scholarship examination on Saturday 6 March 2027.

Applicants for Leadership / Service Scholarships must apply online through the [Academic Assessment Services portal](#) and upload the required documents.

Applicants for Performance Scholarships must apply online through the [Academic Assessment Services portal](#), upload Subject Specific documentation as outlined below and may be invited to attend an audition.

Applicants for Performance Scholarships in Sport must apply online through the [Academic Assessment Services portal](#) and upload documentation providing evidence of sporting success, including representative history, coaching references, achievements and awards received.

All scholarship applications will be assessed; however, only shortlisted applicants and their families will be invited to attend an interview.

WHAT SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION IS REQUIRED FOR A SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION?

Evidence to be provided includes:

- Evidence of high participation in cocurricular activities within the school environment or in the local community.
- Evidence of leadership roles or service.
- Evidence of high academic engagement. (e.g. Academic Competitions, ICAS, ...)
- Student work samples relevant to the scholarship area showing their talent and passion for the area.
- Details and evidence of any additional training in the scholarship area.
- Reference(s) from an independent person working in the scholarship area with the student that can attest to their engagement, contribution, achievement, impact on others and their passion for the area. (e.g., a Christian service scholarship applicant should include a Minister's reference)
- Most recent two school reports and most recent NAPLAN are required for all applicants.
- Any school-based or community awards/certificates.



Applicants for Performance Scholarships (Creative Arts) must include subject-specific evidence in their Portfolio. Students who progress to the 2nd round of the scholarship application process for Music and Drama will be required to attend an in person audition. Dates for auditions will be advised to individual applicants. Music auditions will comprise of two pieces chosen by the applicant. Drama Audition materials can be found at the following links:

Music

Applicants should include evidence of high achievement in relevant music competitions and/or formal examinations, such as certificates and examiner feedback. Links to performance videos (maximum total length of 6 minutes) should also be provided. Additional materials, such as original music compositions, may be included to support the application.

Art

The Art Portfolio should demonstrate evidence of an ongoing art-making practice. Applicants may include a brief CV outlining exhibitions, awards, and any professional or commissioned work (if applicable). The portfolio must contain 8–10 images that showcase the student’s technical ability and creative practice.

Drama

The Drama Portfolio should demonstrate experience, commitment, and achievement in Drama. This may include teacher references, certificates, performance photographs, co-curricular classes, and participation in community theatre or equivalent programs. Applicants may also include evidence of Drama experience beyond performance, such as scriptwriting, short film projects, or production roles.
